TIPS FOR USING YOUR COMPOST BIN

Composting is a simple way to add nutrient-rich humus which fuels plant growth and restores vitality to depleted soil. It's easy to make and good for the environment.

Some of the benefits of home composting include;

Soil conditioner

With compost, you are creating rich humus for lawn and garden. This adds nutrients to your plants and helps retain moisture in the soil

Recycles kitchen and garden waste

Composting can divert as much as 30% of household waste away from the garbage can.

Introduces beneficial organisms to the soil

Microscopic organisms in compost help aerate the soil, break down organic material for plant use and ward off plant disease.

Good for the environment

Composting offers a natural alternative to chemical fertilizers.

Do not compost meat, bones or fish scraps, perennial weeds (they can be spread with the compost) or diseased plants. Do not include pet manures in compost that will be used on food crops. Banana peels, peach peels and orange rinds may contain pesticide residue, and should be kept out of the compost. Sawdust can be added to the compost, but should be mixed or scattered thinly to avoid clumping. Be sure sawdust is clean.

To ensure your compost bin works most effectively, consider the following;

Location

Place your bin on soil in a sunny place in your garden. It will then absorb and traps heat which provides energy to keep working through the night or on cooler days.

Air

The bacteria working on the compostable materials need air, so don't pack the heap too tightly.

A good mix

A balance of woody and sappy materials is just right and adding a thin layer of grass clippings every so-often will help to the success of your compost.

Moisture

The contents of your compost bin needs to be kept damp and moist, but not wet. It will retain moisture and if you have a mix of woody and sappy materials, you should have no problems. If adding a lot of dry matter at one time, a light sprinkling of water of the contents will be beneficial.
