**BULK VERGESIDE COLLECTION REPORT**

**Amendment proposed by Cr Fedele Camarda**

To add the following part 6 to the committee recommendation:

- 6. Delay the launch of the service until *September 2023*, to allow time for:**
  - i. the community to understand the changes and the new service model, and**
  - ii. take full advantage of the communications / support package**

**Reason for Change:**

To ensure that the community and residents have enough time to understand how to use the new service before it goes live.



**FPOL2301-6                      PARKLET POLICY REVIEW**

**Amendment proposed by Cr Andrew Sullivan**

To amend part 1.8 of the policy to read as follows

~~**1.8 — Approval granted for a parklet installation will be initially, and subsequently, for a period of 2 years.**~~

**1.8    Upon granting approval for a parklet, a review will be undertaken by the City every 2 years thereafter to assess compliance in line with this parklet policy and any other policy relevant to the use of the parklet including but not limited to the alfresco dining policy. Parklets found to be non-compliant as part of that review will have a two month period to achieve compliance before approval is granted for the parklet to remain in situ.**

**Reason for change:**

The granting of approval for only a 2 year period may discourage adequate investment in to the parklet infrastructure, making it difficult for applicants to comply with the conditions of the policy.



## FPOL2301-9 HILTON SPORTS PRECINCT

### Amendment proposed by Cr Frank Mofflin

Amend the Committee Recommendation as follows

#### 1. Endorse the Project Principles:

- a. **Place - Define place and land use within the precinct including: sports fields, community use, events, passive recreation, all ages play, family use, dog exercise, transport and access.**
- b. **~~Use~~ Utilisation - Define and accommodate sporting club use including existing formal, informal and new or future uses and set leasing parameters and instruments (such as licenses and seasonal hire arrangements) to inform the scope of community facilities and sports infrastructure.**
- c. **Strategic Alignment – Align plans with City strategic documents including the Strategic Community Plan, Corporate Business Plan, Access and Inclusion Plan, Walyalup Reconciliation Action Plan, Long Term Financial Plan, Greening Fremantle Strategy and the under development Public Open Space Strategy and Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Plan.**
- d. **Assets and Infrastructure - Inform and guide asset renewal planning for all scales of work, inclusive of immediate projects.**
- e. **Services - Investigate and define needs and locations for supporting infrastructure (power, water, sewer etc).**
- f. **Access - Plan for strong site and precinct access considering: public transport, parking, pedestrian to and through site and Access and Inclusion Plan (AIP) integration.**
- g. **Character - Define character elements including palettes for materials, planting and furniture.**
- h. **Budget – align the project with the City’s available capital and renewal budgets in conjunction with **prioritising the identification and active pursuit of additional funding sources including grants and partnerships** ~~identifying and advocating for available grants, partnerships or other funding arrangements to support the financing of the project.~~**
- i. **Sustainability - planning to include One Planet Living principles to support the social, environmental and economic sustainability of the precinct and the long term financial sustainability of clubs.**



### **Reason for changes**

- Change title of Principle B from Use to Utilisation

Reason: Principle a refers to place and land use, utilisation better describes maximising the community outcome from the available resources.

- Modify Principle H

Reason: Language updated to be more active as the current principle only spoke of advocacy rather than pursuing grants.

- Additional Principle I Sustainability added

Reason: Sustainability should underpin all work we do and ensure we are designing for the longer term.

**Council approve the appointment of a suitably qualified consultant to assess opportunities for safe, protected swimming areas for the public in the City of Fremantle. ~~and that a~~ Officers to present a report to be brought back to Council with the findings of this assessment for consideration as part of the to inform the 2023/24 draft budget process which ranks preferred technology and location options by considering:**

- **Location suitability including both river and ocean beaches**
- **Technology efficacy**
- **Overall costs (Capital, Operational and asset life)**
- **Likelihood and potential value of additional funding support**
- **Community use and capacity of City infrastructure to support this expected use**

**Reason for Change:**

This is to ensure that the subsequent report to Council is comprehensive and clearly addresses the issues included in the scope of works; it is important that the report is suitable to allow Elected Members to make a timely and informed decision.
