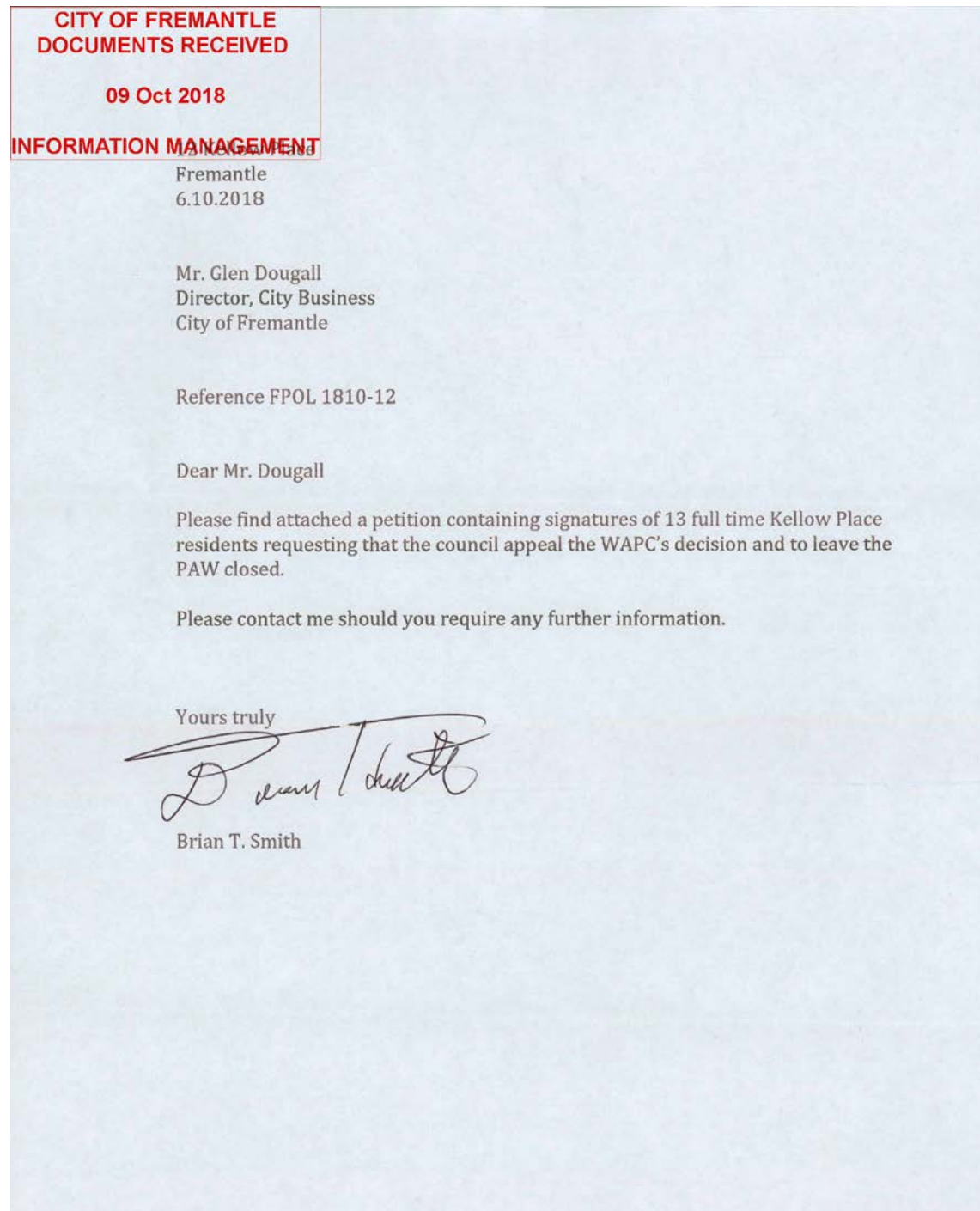

**Proposed alternative recommendation**

Council seek a meeting with the Chair of the Western Australian Planning Committee to seek a review of the decision of the Department of Lands, Planning and Heritage to decline the request to permanently close the Public Access Way at Lot 55 Swanbourne Street, Fremantle.

**Reason for change**

The access way could easily be replicated with a pathway along Bolton Place to Swanbourne Street and is not an essential element to the path network in this location.

**FPOL1810-12 UPDATE REPORT - PAW CLOSURE LOT 55 SWANBOURNE STREET, FREMANTLE LINKING KELLOW PLACE**

**Proposed alternative recommendation**

Council;

1. Seek to keep the Public Access Way at Lot 55 Swanbourne Street, Fremantle, closed whilst further investigative work takes place on the local path network in this location,
2. Review the options to the path network in the location of Kellow Place and Bolton Way for appropriate options to the network that may eliminate the need for the Public Access Way between Kellow Place and Swanbourne Street,
3. Once appropriate options have been determined in part 1 above, undertake further consultation with the community of Kellow Place and Bolton Way on the preferred options, and
4. Report back to council on a preferred option, if determined through part 2 above, for consideration of further action.

**Reason for change**

The access way could easily be replicated with a pathway along Bolton Place to Swanbourne Street and is not an essential element to the path network in this location. Further consultation can take place with the community to consider the most appropriate option for the network.
