ELECTED MEMBER SUMMARY

OFFICER COMMENT

Regulation 10 of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*, outlines the requirements to revoke or change a Council decision. In accordance with Regulation 10(1)(b), a motion to revoke or change a decision of Council requires at least 1/3 of Council members to sign in support of the motion. If this requirement has been met, the motion will require an absolute majority decision of Council to be passed. If achieved, Council may then consider the second proposed motion to reinstate the original Officer's Recommendation.

The City's Meeting Procedures Policy also states that Council is not to consider a motion to revoke or change a decision 'where, at the time the motion is moved or notice is given, any action has been taken to implement the decision'. At this point in time, officers have not commenced implementation of the decision of Council dated 14th February 2024 and there are no perceived legal or financial consequences should Council revoke and change the Council Decision.

Should the second motion be supported and passed by Council, officers will contact the property owner to advise of the Council decision and commence implementation of the decision.
