Introduction

The City of Fremantle's Strategic Community Plan clearly shows the community's passion for creating a sustainable world that values people and the environment. For this reason, One Planet Living has been a part of the Fremantle sustainability story for 5 years, guiding the City's progress towards minimising resource use and maximising happiness, for its own operations and in the community.

One Planet Living is a vision for a sustainable world where people lead healthy, happy lives within their fair share of the earth's resources, created and overseen by not-for-profit Bioregional. It is based on ten principles of sustainability that provide a holistic framework to plan, deliver and communicate sustainability for organisations, cities and developments.

Purpose

The purpose of the One Planet Action Plan is to outline some of the City of Fremantle's priority activities to advance One Planet principles and the overarching goal of sustainable living for the next five years. The Plan focusses on corporate activities which the City can control but also includes initiatives aimed at enabling and supporting community actions.

The Plan is not a comprehensive review of all activities which contribute to One Planet Living but rather a snapshot of some of the key priorities for the next few years. It does not seek to duplicate the full organizational business plan but to illustrate how key focus activities contribute towards the One Planet Living vision.


The Plan is a 'live' document and will be reviewed and updated annually to ensure that it stays relevant, effective and achievable.

Discussion

The actions in this Plan align with goals, outcomes and objectives within the Strategic Community Plan. The Strategic Community Plan was developed following a major community visioning exercise involving close to 1000 people held in 2013-14 which defined community priorities for the City and community over the next 15 years. The themes arising from the visioning process were:

1. People:	A welcoming place for all
2. Plan:	A liveable city that serves its residents needs and values heritage
3. Prosper:	A diverse and unique local economy and a recognised centre of excellence
4. Green:	A city that values its environment
5. Create:	A dynamic innovative city with a strong knowledge economy and arts sector
6. Decide:	A collaborative and connected community with a shared vision and good governance

These are reflected in the key focus areas of the Strategic Community Plan namely:



The City delivers a wide range of services, programs and activities which align with these themes, informed by a range of subsidiary strategies and action plans. Community engagement has informed these more detailed documents also.

Targets

Advancement towards One Planet Living principles and the goals of the Strategic Community Plan is an ongoing process. To monitor progress, targets have been established in some areas whilst in others reporting is more qualitative.

Above all, the City wishes to ensure that its activities align to its principles and goals, which the One Planet Living framework assists in assuring.

Monitoring, Reporting and Review

The City's progress towards One Planet principles and associated targets and delivery of the Plan will be reported annually to Bioregional to ensure it continues to progress and incorporate best practice.

The Action Plan is updated annually to ensure that it stays relevant, effective and achievable.
