I grew up in Fremantle, the daughter of Croatian immigrants, raised with strong family and community values that shaped my commitment to service. Fremantle has always been a place of diversity, resilience, and community spirit-qualities that guide me today.

As GM of Jundalya, an Aboriginal owned recruitment business, I work with Indigenous communities and the mining sector. I see daily how opportunities change lives.

From 2019-2023, I served as a Fremantle Councillor, standing up for ratepayers by exposing the Civic Centre blowout, defending our CAT bus service, and opposing the sell off of community assets. My approach has always been practical, bold, and accountable-focused on outcomes, not spin.

This October, I'm putting my hand up for both Mayor of Fremantle and Coastal Ward Councillor. Of course, I can only serve in one role-and it's up to you, the people of Fremantle, to decide where I can best represent our community.

As Mayor, I will return my remuneration of \$600,000 over 4 years back into our community.

As Coastal Ward Councillor, I will return \$140,000 to kickstart local projects.

With community input, these funds will support:

Youth Homelessness - Mandurah's Passages Hub secured \$900k in state funding in 2024. Fremantle deserves the same.

Sporting Clubs - decades of neglect demand investment

Heritage - Reinstate the annual Heritage Awards and fund projects that protect Fremantle's unique history.

My Priorities on Council

Scrutinise finances and ensure transparency

Fight for the return of the CAT bus

Focus on basics - roads, rubbish, rates, amenities, lighting

Restore cancelled business rubbish services

Secure a new lease with Notre Dame and introduce a \$10 Round House tourist ticket, raising about \$1.3m annually
