

City of Fremantle Local Parking Law 2021

Residents Free Parking Permit Conditions of Use

- Permits can <u>only</u> be issued to persons currently residing within the boundaries of the City of Fremantle. Permits are <u>not</u> available for commercial properties or ratepayers who are not residents.
- 2. This permit exempts the holder from the payment of parking fees during the following times <u>ONLY</u> (including public holidays) for all standard on-street (kerbside) car parking bays:

Valid Monday – Sunday (seven days per week):

- Free parking from 9.00am to 11.00am. Permit holders must abide the posted time limits (e.g. 30 minutes, 1 hour, 2 hours)
- Free parking from 3.00pm to 5.00pm. Permit holders must abide the posted time limits (e.g. 30 minutes, 1 hour, 2 hours)
- Free parking from 5.00pm to 1.00am. Time restrictions do not apply.

Saturday/Sunday

8am to 5pm – carpark 12B (Beach Street)

Additionally on Saturday/ Sunday residents can park in carpark 12B (Beach Street) from 8.00am to 5.00pm.

- 3. The permit <u>does not</u> authorize parking in these areas: ACROD bays, No Parking areas, No Standing zones, Loading Zones, No Stopping Areas, Taxi Zones, Bus Zones, Tour Coach Zones, Authorised Parking Only areas, Permit Zones, Private Property Parking areas and 15 minute zones.
- 4. All permits expire on the 30 November. Residents who are ratepayers will have the following year permits sent to them. If you are a tenant, it is the applicants' responsibility to renew their permit upon expiry as reminder notices may not be issued.
- 5. A maximum of two permits will be issued per property.

The applicant is required to provide the City with proof of residential status. A ratepayer who resides in the City of Fremantle can provide the rates assessment number. Residents can provide a copy of a current tenancy agreement or a letter from the agent/owner/person on the tenancy confirming occupancy. Note: min 6 months tenancy agreement. Driver license, Bills, rental receipts and insurance papers will not be accepted

6. Vehicle registration papers <u>must</u> show the vehicle is registered in your name and the address to which you are applying for. If your current vehicle Registration Certificate doesn't have the correct address, you must show the original registration papers of the applicant with the previous address, <u>as well as</u> the sticker on the reverse side of your driver's licence mailed from the Department of Transportation with your new address

- 7. In the case of an employer provided vehicle, a letter must be provided from the employer stating that the applicant has permission to use the vehicle for private use within Fremantle.
- 8. Applications will not be accepted if the above documentation is <u>not</u> provided.
- 9. Making a false or misleading entry on the application form or applying for a permit without a legitimate entitlement will result in any permits previously issued being withdrawn and the offending person being permanently prohibited from being issued any further permits. Prosecution may also result.
- 10. Holders of valid Residential Parking Permits are entitled to the same parking concessions and do <u>not</u> need to apply for an additional permit. Visitor's Parking Permits are not eligible for this concession.
- 11. Permits will also be issued to the carers of non-car owning City of Fremantle residents and ratepayers who are (a) aged pensioners or (b) persons with disabilities. In such circumstances, the following is required:
 - (a) proof of residence for the aged pensioner or person with disabilities;
 - (b) proof of vehicle ownership for the carer's vehicle;
 - (c) a statutory declaration signed by the carer, stating that the permit is to be used for the purpose assisting the aged pensioner or person with the disabilities with their transport needs in Fremantle.
- 12. Permits are <u>not</u> transferable to another person.
- 13. A permit can be transferred to another vehicle on application to the City of Fremantle.
- 14. The permit <u>must</u> be attached to the vehicle's windscreen, passenger side bottom **left** hand corner.
- 15. "Vehicle" is defined as a motor car capable of carrying up to nine persons, utility with a carrying capacity of 1000kg or less, a wan with a carrying capacity of 1000kg or less, a motorcycle, a motorcycle with a sidecar, or tricycle motorcycle.
- 16. There are no fees for Residents & Ratepayers Free Parking Permits.
- 17. Please ensure that if you sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle you <u>remove</u> the sticker and bring it in to the Service & Information Centre for a replacement for your new vehicle (the entitlement for the permit does not transfer to the new owner with the vehicle). A statutory declaration is required should you not be able to present the sticker.
- 18. You will be taken to have accepted the conditions of issue and use if the permit is not returned to us and received within 14 days of the date of issue of the permit.
- 19. These conditions are subject to change without notice.
